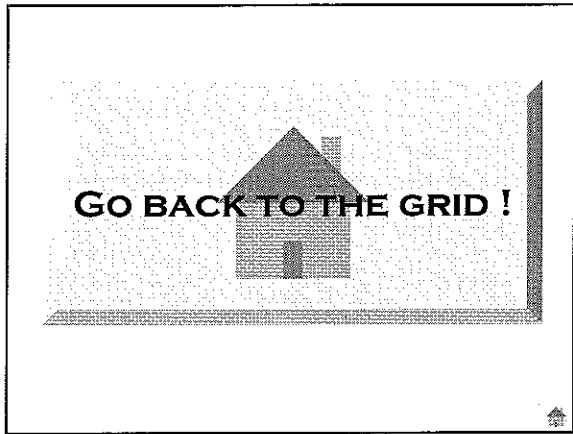

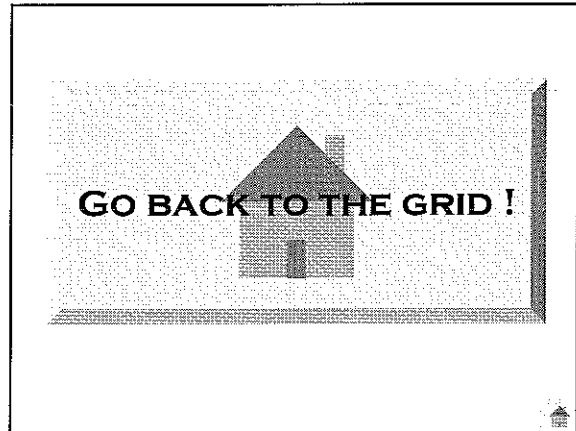

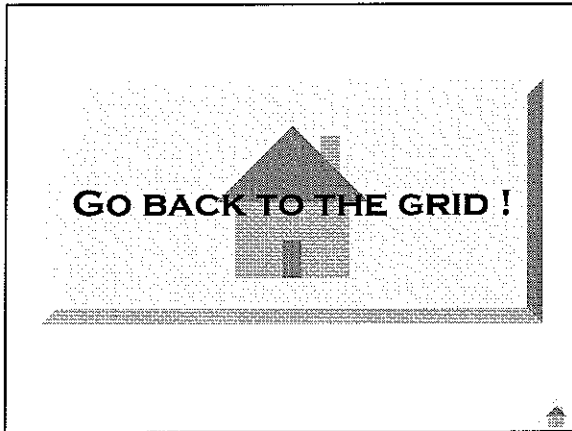

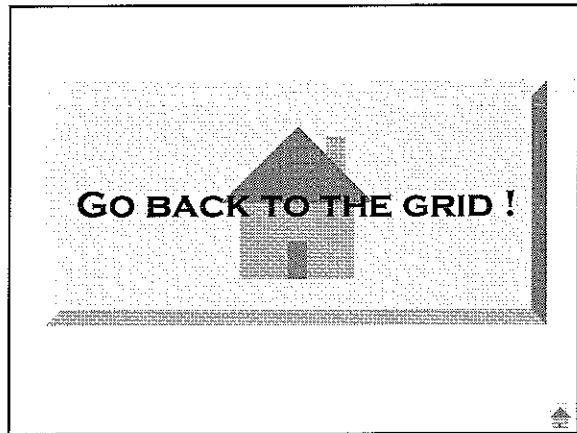

- A current appointment on a surgical staff of the applicant's primary hospital
- A current practice that establishes the applicant as a specialist in surgery
- Interest in pursuing excellence
- Ethical fitness

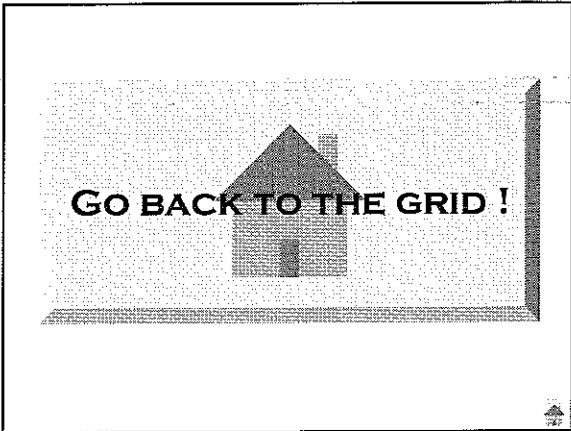
